### **Schools in Focus**

### **The German Academy**

Our objective is to promote the German language and the culture of the German speaking countries. We organise German language projects and events, and facilitate and support German language

learning and bilingualism from an early age. We run a German Saturday School where bilinguals and beginners alike learn German in a very active and engaged way. Students of all ages are immersed in a German-speaking learning environment where they will experience adventures, build new friendships and have fun together. We learn language through play, theatre, sports, arts and crafts, and have even been taking part in a German TV-show. Our students can enter GCSE, A-level and Goethe exams. At our Language Kindergarten, children are surrounded by both German and English, and will pick up the German language, pronunciation and accent quickly and naturally. The Kindergarten is open three days a week.

We also run different adults' classes and Kinderclubs (German afterschool clubs). Additional events throughout the year include a German summer school week for school aged children, a big summer family festival to celebrate the lightest day of the year, and a yearly ski week in Switzerland. Around 170 children, young people and adults are currently attending classes and events at the German Academy.

# Closer relationship is needed between Complementary Schools and Mainstream Schools: Headteacher's perspective

Abbey Primary is a community school (with 150+ adults a week being educated) and also acts as a hub for complementary schools.

From September to November 2014 I (plus my SENDCo and other senior leaders) contributed to the delivery of the 'OCN Effective Teaching Skills in Supplementary Schools' programme, which led to 16 delegates from a range of complementary schools gaining this qualification.

I strongly believe that links with complementary schools can help in raising aspirations, engaging parents, supporting mainstream school delivery of community languages, increasing cultural engagement and creating a culture of achievement across the local community.

However, current changes in the educational landscape such as the formation of academy chains and the reduced capacity of the local authority are definitely a threat to the opportunity for complementary and mainstream schools to work in partnership.

Abbey Primary has worked very closely with Aqoon, developing ongoing academic tuition for Year 6 pupils through their 'Complements to 4' programme and supporting the newly introduced Saturday morning Dadaal Tutorials for twelve Year 5 and 6 pupils of Somali heritage.

Teachers from our local group of complementary schools have visited Abbey for learning walks and have attended whole school 'Safeguarding and Child Protection' training. I make regular 'drop-ins' to the Indian Education Society and Madrassa sessions, visiting classes and offering support and feedback. Approximately half of each pupil base for these complementary schools is from current or ex-Abbey pupils. The higher the quality of learning in both mainstream and complementary schools, the stronger overall outcomes will be for students.

A closer relationship between Abbey and local complementary schools remains a key focus for us in continuing to raise aspirations and achievement for our pupils and families.
